MacArthur project

- Maintain, evaluate and improve long term **monitoring** and evaluation
- Build capacity for science based conservation in changing world
- Carry out pilot studies to recognise
 change (climate, invasive species,
 population trends, etc)
 - Build effective **partnerships** and alliances, increase **visibility**

Monitoring

- Maintained and improved ecological monitoring of BMCA (weather, resource use, water)
- Analysed long term monitoring data sets; evaluation; lessons learned
- Developed new monitoring (Bwindi vegetation & vertebrates; Rwenzori & Elgon vegetation at high altitude; phenology)



Capacity building

- Scholarships for Master students' fieldwork
 - 9 Masters students funded by MA
 - 3 Masters students funded by USAID, through WCS project WILD-West
- 4 PhD students linked with ITFC
- Training UWA rangers (weather data collection, GPS refresher training)



Pilot studies

- The impact of *elephants* on trees
- Land use change and carbon stocks
- Birds as indicators for the conservation value of matrix habitats
- Emigration and land abandonment in and around Bwindi
- Altitudinal zonation of birds species
- Inventory of Myrianthus holstii in Bwindi
- Inventory of **hemi-parasitic plants** in Bwindi
- Invasive plant species in Semuliki
- Inventory of amphibians
- Rodents as potential carriers of parasites across park border
- Baboons as potential reservoirs of **zoonotic pathogens**
- Resilience of trees to elephants in Rabongo forest
